Man dies in police cell after stealing in church

A man allegedly caught stealing in a church in Machagua village, Embu County ended dying in a police station before getting a change to confess the crime or repent. Henry Muchangi Ireri, 24, was nabbed by a worshipper at a local Salvation Army Church. After she raised the alarm, neighbors rushed to the church and escorted Ireri to Kigumo police post where he was locked up for interrogation. President caught stealing a pen in an official visit to Chile
